Reading Comprehension

- 1. Teen author Olivia Amiri says she realized that writing and storytelling are directly linked, and the way you say a phrase and the tone in which you write are similar, which made her a better writer. Discuss these ideas with students. Ask them if they have an interest in being writer, and to write their reasons for their answer.
- 2. In his column, Conrad J. Storad tells us why leaves change color every autumn. He offers many interesting facts about leaves, such as leaves drop from about 203 billion trees in the United States every fall. Ask kids to write several more fascinating facts about leaves and their colors.
- 3. Children's author and illustrator Heidi Woodward Sheffield tells aspiring writers and illustrators to take the earplugs out, to write every day about a strong emotion, and to read. And she says don't let grammar decide if you like to write. Ask students if they like to write or draw. Have them give some reasons for their answer.
- 4. A student's first day at school, or returning to school can be stressful for some kids, stirring up all kinds of first-day jitters, as we see in the story *Back to School*, Backpack! Ask students to think of what their first day of school was like for them. Have them write a paragragh describing their day in detail and the emotions they experienced.
- 5. The little boy in *Just Snow Already!* is so caught up in watching for snow to arrive that he doesn't see all the crazy stuff going on right on his street. Can students relate to this character? Have them write about something they were too focused on (video game, TV program, etc.) instead of seeing the things around them that make a difference.
