Ask kids to think of and write about one way they could give something back to their community.
- 3. The book *Ducks Overboard!* is a true story about the enormous amount of plastic that continues to pollute our oceans. See if kids can think of one way that they can do their part to stop ocean pollution and have them write a few sentences about it.
- 4. Children's book author Deedee Cummings says that summer reading is cool. Books open up a world of learning, adventure, and excitement in a way that nothing else can. Ask students if they read during the summer, and to write about why they dislike or like to read when they are not in the classroom.

He wants learning about science to be fun. Ask kids if they're interested in science and to write about what their experience has been like learning about it.
