Reading Comprehension

1. Teen author Olivia Amiri discusses the pressure of being asked, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" She thinks it's unnecessary, and explains that her interests and priorities could change. She wants to concentrate on her present self. Ask students what they think when asked this question and if they agree with Amiri.

- 2. In *My Name is Layla*, the main character is used to awkward social situations and disappointing academic performances due to her dyslexia. Define and discuss "dyslexia" with students and ask them what they think it'd be like to experience Layla's situation.
- 3. The author of *Dear Librarian* says each community has children who need the library for a variety of reasons. Ask students if they use their local library and to write what they like most about it. If they don't go to the library, ask them to write the reasons why they don't.
- 4. *Sam's First Word* is a story about looking beyond yourself to what others are doing and being excited for their accomplishments. Discuss these ideas with students and ask them to write about a situation where they were glad for someone else's achievement.
- 5. Aiden Adams is only 6, but he is already a published author, environmentalist, and songwriter. He says, "If you work hard and use your imagination, you can be anything you want to be. But it's most important to be yourself." Discuss these ideas with students and ask them to write some reasons why they think it's important to be yourself.
